Be Prepared

- Check the weather before your trip
- Inspect your vehicle
- Top off fluids and bring extra
- Pack a spill kit, spare parts, trash bags
- Bring food, water
- Carry a fire extinguisher & First aid kit
- Carry recovery gear and a trail map
- Have a recovery plan
(USFS does not recover your vehicle if disabled)



OHV Trail Pass Required

- On the OHV trail system, you must display a trail pass on your vehicle, atv, utv, dirt bike or mountain bicycle.
- Day pass \$5, expires at midnight date of issue
Seasonal pass \$30, valid April 1 – December 15
- Display passes on right rear fenders for all-terrain vehicles and rear fenders for dirt bikes.
- Display passes on four-wheel-drive windshields



**No tag & Registration
No roadway driving
No exceptions**

On roads inside of Uwharrie National Forest you must have both a license plate & a registration for the vehicle you operate.

**Trailer unlicensed vehicles to trail heads for off loading.
Operate only on OHV trails.**


**No Farm Plates, No Transferring of License Plates.
UNF does not recognize license plates on ATV/UTV/Dirt Bikes
from other states. (Exception = Enduro)**



**No unlicensed or un-registered
Full Sized 4x4, ATV, UTV, Dirt bike
on roadways**

**No exceptions, except to cross
You may cross over a roadway
from one side of a trail to
another.**


Violations subject to fines.





Please be courteous in parking lots
& trail heads. **Unload & Go!**

- Do not block trail access while unloading
- Do not spin your tires, race, speed, climb in the parking areas
- Do not allow children to operate atv/utv/dirt bikes in parking areas except to access trails while supervised
- Do not block other vehicles
- No campfires in parking areas
- Place garbage in trash cans

Understand the Liabilities You Assume


The Moment You Drive or Step Onto the OHV Trail System

- An off-highway vehicle operator **shall accept all legal responsibility for injury or damage** of any kind to the extent that the injury or damage results from risks inherent in the sport of off-highway vehicle use and shall regulate personal conduct at all times so that injury to self or other persons or property that results from the risks inherent in the sport of off-highway vehicle operation is avoided.
- Risks inherent in the sport of off-highway operation include variations in terrain, surface or subsurface conditions, crevices, ravines, streams, poor visibility, rocks, trees, other forms of forest growth or debris, and any other natural hazard.
- An off-highway vehicle operator is responsible for:
 - (a) knowing the range of the operator's ability to navigate any slope, trail, or area for off highway vehicle use within the limits of the operator's ability, taking into consideration the conditions;
 - (b) maintaining control of speed and course at all times while operating the off-highway vehicle;
 - (c) heeding all posted warnings; and
 - (d) refraining from acting in a manner that may cause or contribute to the injury of anyone.




On OHV Trails

- **Drive on designated motorized routes**, follow orange 
- **Do not block the trail.** If you must stop, pull to the side, out of others way. If you are navigating a difficult obstacle or your vehicle is disabled, **hand signal** others to wait or go around.
- **Stay on the trail.** Going around obstacles widens trails, impacts vegetation and causes erosion. If you cannot go over or around while staying on trail, go back the way you came.
- **Control your wheel spin** to avoid adding to trail erosion.
- **Do not breach barriers** or use barriers as an anchor point.



On OHV Trails

- When **approaching another vehicle** from behind, pass on the left, at a safe distance and slow speed.
- Understand vehicle differences. **Motorcycles** have a certain minimum speed they can travel before they want to flop over. When passing a **full-size** 4WD vehicle, be patient, larger vehicles take longer to navigate obstacles.
- **Motorcycle and ATV riders** – do not roost the vehicles you are passing.



On OHV Trails

- When **passing or meeting other riders** on the trail, **hand signal** to let them know how many vehicles are behind you




of Fingers = # vehicles in your group
Closed fist = last vehicle in group





On OHV Trails

- **Yield** the right of way to vehicles passing you from behind or traveling uphill.
- Slower vehicles yield to faster vehicles
descending yield to climbing
There are exceptions relative to obstacles on the trail.
- Stay on the trail, do not drive into the tree line, use designated “pull off” areas if you must stop.

**Pedestrians
Bicycles**

**Horses
Hikers**



Barriers

- Barriers are installed to protect the environment and wildlife habitats behind them.
- May be metal, wood, bales of straw or downed trees
- Primarily installed by volunteers
- Do not use as an anchor point
- Do not drive behind, under or around barriers

DUI applies to all motor vehicles on OHV trails





ATV/Dirt bikes



USDA Federal Law 36 CFR 261.50 (a - e)

PPE Required: ATV / Motorcycle operators and passengers must wear eye protection and a DOT Helmet.

Operator Age Restrictions While Under Adult Supervision:

Under age 8 – No Operation of ATV/SXS/Dirt bike

Ages 8 -12 can operate size 70 CC and under

Ages 12-16 can operate size 90 CC and under

Age 16 – can operate any ATV or Motorcycle while supervised

ATV/SXS/Dirt bike operator cannot carry passenger(s) unless vehicle was factory manufactured with a seat designated for passengers . After market seats do not apply.

ATV/SXS/Dirt bike must have a spark arresting device installed and functioning in order to operate.


Volunteers
